



# **Goals & Purpose**

- Part of a vision of post-secondary success for all
- Increase adult educational attainment to meet State's 60x30 goal
- Close Michigan's skills gap
- Provide individual opportunities for Michiganders to follow dreams, find better jobs
- Increase community college enrollment, especially in the pandemic





# **Benefits & Eligibility**

- Tuition-free access to local community colleges for adults (in-district tuition rate at all public community colleges and tribal colleges)
- Last-dollar funds—Pell and TIP awarded first
- Must be pursuing *Pell-eligible* associate degree or occupational skills certificate

To be eligible:

- Michigan resident for previous year
- Have a high school diploma, GED or equivalent
- At least 25 years of age
- Have not earned a college degree



#### **Reconnect Coverage**

After taking account of any federal Pell grants or State tuition-restricted scholarships, Reconnect will ensure that the following items will be free on the semester bill from the community college:

- ✓ Tuition (in-district)
- Mandatory fees (fees charged to all students)
- Contact hours (extra charges for certain courses)


Costs Reconnect *does not* cover include:

- Non-mandatory fees (course-specific fees, like lab fees, distance learning fees, etc.)
- Athletic fees
- Parking fees
- Indirect costs (books, technology, transportation, etc.)



#### Applying & Receiving the Award

- Apply online: Michigan.gov/Reconnect
  - 1. Apply and be admitted to community college
  - 2. Submit a federal aid application (FAFSA)
  - 3. Enroll in classes at least half-time (6 credits) towards associate degree or certificate program

Congratulations on taking the first step toward earning your certificate or degree! Michigan Reconnect is a scholarship program that pays you to attend your in-district community college tuition free or pays up to the in-district rate if you attend a community college where you're considered out-of-district.

To be eligible, you must:

- Be at least 25 years old when you apply
- Have lived in Michigan for a year or more
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Have not yet completed a college degree (associate or bachelor's)

If you do not have a high school diploma or equivalent, visit Michigan.gov/LearnMoreEarnMore to get started.

To participate in the Reconnect scholarship, you must complete four steps:

- Apply online for Michigan Reconnect. The application takes less than five minutes to complete and can be done on a mobile phone. If you are having difficulties on your mobile device, it is recommended to use a different browser or computer.
- Apply to a Michigan public community college. All public community colleges, including tribal colleges, in Michigan qualify. If you're already
  enrolled at a public community college this step is completed. If you're not, remember your tuition is free at an in-district community college,
  but that Reconnect only pays part of the tuition if you attend an out-of-district community college. See What costs does Reconnect cover?
- Submit your FAFSA. This is free financial aid provided by the federal government.
- Enroll in an eligible program and start classes. You must be in school at least half time and stay enrolled continuously through graduation.




My caseload (WCCCD applicants) as of 3.25.2022:
